## Camp William S. Potter Patches

Camp Potter served as the segregated camp for Chehaw Council until the mid-1960s, when all scouts began attending Camp Osborn. Since the 1960s there have been occasional Council camporees at Camp Potter and some individual troops have made use of it for camping. The camp was sold prior to the council merger.
